

Cascade Well 6

The City of Gresham and the Rockwood Water People’s Utility District (RWPUD) formed the Cascade Groundwater Alliance (CGA) project to build and operate an independent, safe, and reliable water system. The new groundwater system consists of nine interrelated projects including renewed and new wells, treatment facilities, reservoirs, well connections and water transmission pipes. Project number five is made up of the Cascade Well 6 and the 223rd Water Treatment Facility.

Cascade Well 6 and Water Treatment Facility Project Highlights

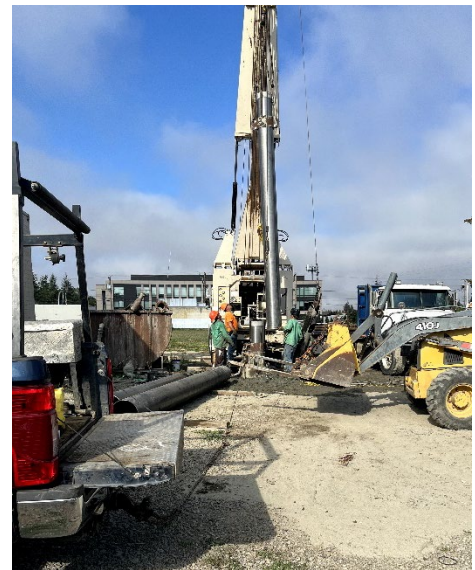

Project Status (Project 5)

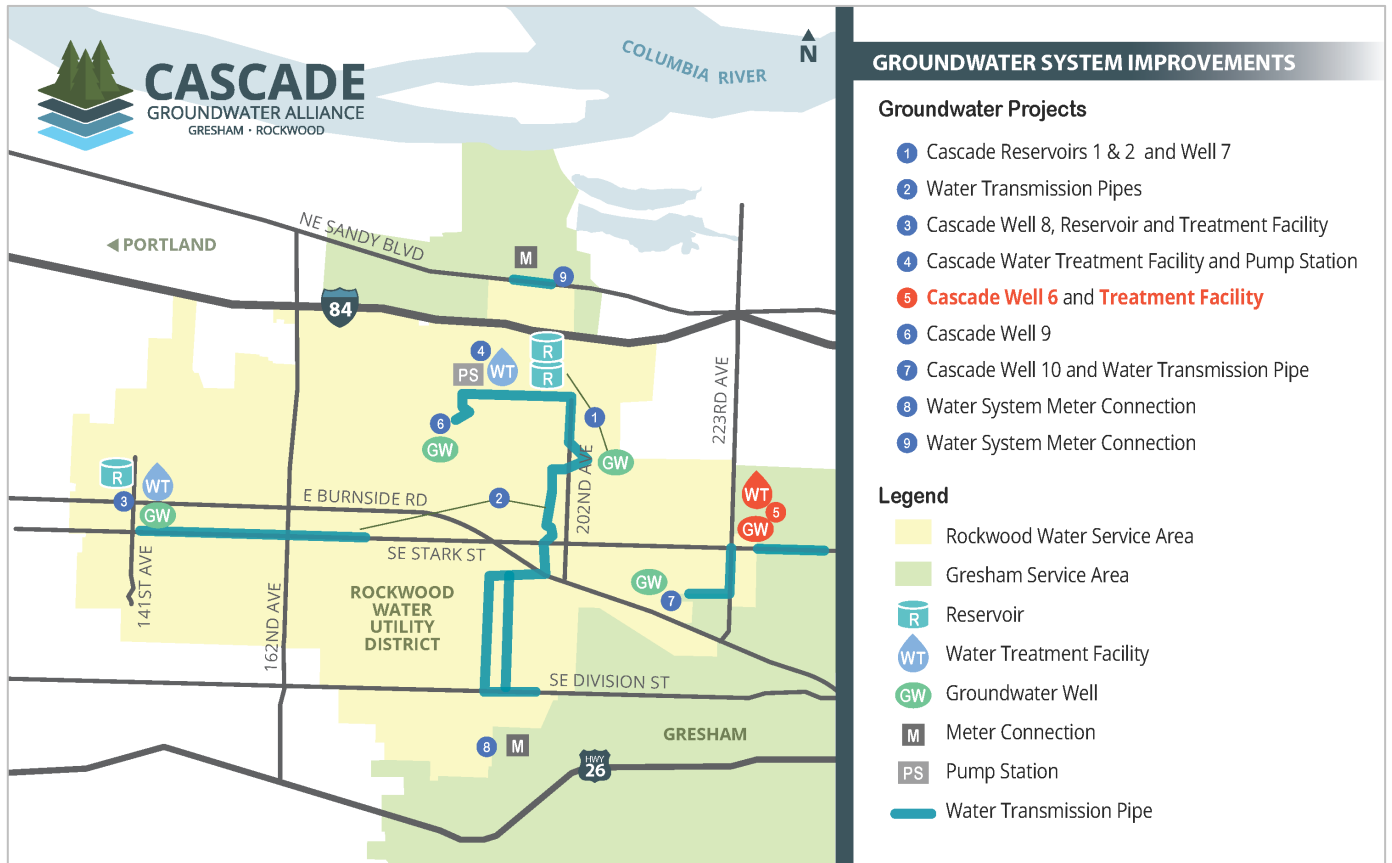
Cascade Well 6 and 223rd Water Treatment Facility (Anticipated)
